

We wish to thank all the teams who played for being part of this event. We wish you Happy New Year's Eve and a great 2023!







Looking at a singleton diamond perhaps 3NT was a tad optimistic.

West led the \$\infty\$5 for the queen and king and East won the first round of diamonds with the ace and returned the \$\infty\$8 for the ten and jack. When West switched to the \$\infty\$8 East took the ace and played another club, West winning with the nine and exiting with the three. When the heart finesse lost East exited with a diamond and West cashed out for three down, -300 and 10 more IMPs.


The final deal of the half might be considered amusing in so far as one pair bid to 5% which had three losers, while the other stopped in 3%. The effect was to give Uli another 7 IMPs and a commanding lead.

Session 2

Trailing by 29.1 IMPs, ECF Holding were hoping for a lively set of deals. They would be hoping they could keep a clean sheet and that the offered a chance of swings.

On Board 3 both sides reached 1NT and defender on lead decided to lead from $\heartsuit Q1093$. When the $\heartsuit 10$ was led declarer could see \heartsuit A842 in dummy and held $\heartsuit J765$ in hand. Going up with the ace caught the king and declarer could subsequently organize three heart tricks finishing with +120. In the replay North started with the $\heartsuit 3$ and when declarer played low from dummy South could win and switch to spades, which eventually resulted in one down, giving Uli 6 IMPs.



On the deal that followed history repeated itself, 1NT making with an overtrick in one room and going one down in the other for another 6 IMPs to Uli. (Only my membership of the David Bird anti 1NT reporting Party prevents me from revealing the full details, but in essence one defender held $\heartsuit A3$ and when declarer played a heart towards the $\heartsuit Q105$ it was essential to go up with the ace as partner held $\heartsuit KJ764$ and playing low blocked the suit.)

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
